JACKPOT INFO

1. The estimated Powerball jackpot for Wednesday, Aug. 23, is \$700 million. Players can choose to receive the jackpot in 30 graduated payments over 29 years or in one cash payment. Jackpot winners have 60 days from the winning draw date to choose cash or annuity payment. After 60 days, unclaimed jackpot prizes can only be claimed with the annuity payment.
2. If the winner chooses the single cash payment, he or she will receive roughly half of the advertised amount in one lump sum. Wednesday's cash option would bring a single player approximately \$443.3 million in one payment, before taxes.
3. The Missouri Lottery withholds 25 percent federal and 4 percent state taxes for a total of 29 percent.
4. The Wednesday night draw will be the 21st drawing since the jackpot was last hit on June 10 for \$447.8 million. That ticket was sold in Menifee, California, and was claimed by Jeff Lindsay.
5. This is the second-highest Powerball jackpot ever offered.
6. The top 10 highest Powerball jackpots are:
 - **\$1,586,400,000** – on Jan. 13, 2016, split three ways to players in California, Florida and Tennessee.
 - **\$590,500,000** – on May 18, 2013, to Gloria Mackenzie of Zephyrhills, Fla.
 - **\$587,500,000** – on Nov. 28, 2012, split two ways to: Cindy and Mark Hill of Dearborn, Mo.; and Matthew Good of Fountain Hills, Ariz.
 - **\$564,100,000** – on Feb. 11, 2015, split three ways to players in North Carolina, Puerto Rico and Texas.
 - **\$487,000,000** – on July 30, 2016, to one ticket holder who purchased his/her ticket in New Hampshire.

- **\$448,400,000** – on Aug. 7, 2013, split three ways to one player in Minnesota and two players in New Jersey.
- **\$447,800,000** – on June 10, 2017, with one ticket sold in Menifee, California, to Jeff Lindsay.
- **\$435,300,000** – on Feb. 22, 2017, to one player in Indiana.
- **\$429,600,000** – on May 7, 2016, with one ticket purchased by the Smith Family Lottery Pool (group of eight from Trenton and Newark, New Jersey.) The retail location was 7-Eleven, 750 Chambers St., in Trenton.
- **\$425,300,000** – on Feb. 19, 2014, sold at Dixon Landing Chevron in Milpitas, Calif., to B. Raymond Buxton.

7. The three highest lottery jackpots awarded nationwide were:

- **\$1.58 billion** Powerball jackpot won on Jan. 13, 2016, with three tickets (\$528.6 million each) sold in Chino Hills, Calif., Melbourne Beach, Florida, and Munford, Tennessee.
- **\$656 million** Mega Millions jackpot won March 30, 2012, with three tickets (\$218.6 million each) sold in Ottawa, Kan., Red Bud, Ill., and Milford Mill, Md.
- **\$648 million** Mega Millions jackpot won on Dec. 17, 2013, with two tickets sold in California and Georgia

WINNER INFO

1. Of the 47 lotteries that offer Powerball, Missouri is ranked second in terms of Powerball winners with 31. (First is Indiana with 39.) More than \$2.2 billion in Powerball jackpots alone have been won by Missouri Lottery players during the past 25 years. During the past year, Missouri has ranked approximately eighth in terms of sales among the member lotteries.

2. Fifty-four Powerball players have won \$1 million or more by matching all five white-ball numbers (46 since the Powerball changes in January 2012).
3. A total of 118 Powerball players in Missouri have won the \$50,000 prize by matching four white-ball numbers and the Powerball number since the prize went from \$10,000 to \$50,000 in October 2015.
4. The last time someone won a Powerball jackpot in Missouri was July 4, 2015, when Tom and Cathy Rea, St. Louis, claimed a ticket worth \$70 million.

1. An average week of Missouri Powerball sales (based on the current 52 weeks) is approximately \$1.8 million.
2. Missouri sold more than \$4.5 million in Powerball tickets during the past week (Aug. 13-19).

2. The drawing is at 9:59 p.m. Central Time. Players can buy tickets in Missouri up to 8:59 p.m. Wednesday night. The drawing is held in Tallahassee, Fla.
3. Approximately 4,800 terminals in Missouri sell Powerball tickets.
4. There are 47 members in Powerball: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, D.C., Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Vermont, the Virgin Islands, West Virginia, Washington, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

WHERE THE MONEY GOES

Approximately 66.6 cents of Lottery purchases are returned to players in prizes, and about 23 cents goes toward funding for Missouri's public elementary, secondary and higher education. Retailers who sell Lottery tickets receive approximately 5.9 cents of every dollar and about 4.5 cents is used for administrative costs.

HOW TO PLAY

- Pick five numbers between 1 and 69. Then pick one additional number between 1 and 26 as the Powerball.
- Players can win nine ways on Powerball, ranging from the jackpot down to \$4.
- If your Powerball number matches the Powerball number drawn, you win a prize. Without the Powerball number, you have to match at least three of the other five numbers to win a prize.
- The overall chances of winning a prize in Powerball are 1 in 24.87.
- Powerball players can also increase their non-jackpot winnings up to 10 times using the Power Play feature when the jackpot is between \$40 and \$150 million and up to five times when the jackpot is higher. For \$1 extra, players can automatically win \$2 million for matching all five white-ball numbers using the Power Play option, or up to 10 times the original prize for the other prize levels. - Approximately 85 percent of Powerball players use Quick Pick to select their numbers during an average period.

TIPS

- Play early to avoid long lines. The terminals will shut down at 8:59 p.m. Wednesday, and no one will be able to buy tickets after that time.
- Play within your means. It only takes one ticket to win.
- When you buy a ticket, sign it immediately and keep it in a safe place. Like money, it is a bearer instrument.
- Be sure to check your ticket closely. Even if you don't win the jackpot, you may have won one of the eight other prizes in the game.
