## Alliance Chairperson Letter Bets Off Branding Receives 'Fresh' Update

Have you seen our new advertising campaign? In honor of its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the Missouri Alliance to Curb Problem Gambling introduced a new awareness campaign and logo: "Don't Let Gambling Break You." The bright artwork and new logo can be seen on billboards across Missouri, and posters and brochures will soon be available, too. New public service announcements (PSAs) were also created and aired during March's National Problem Gambling Awareness Month.



The whole reason the Missouri Alliance exists is to educate Missourians on the characteristics and dangers of problem and compulsive gambling, and to raise awareness that free help is available. Keeping artwork and materials fresh and eye-catching is key in attracting attention to the toll-free helpline number – 1-888-BETSOFF – and reaching those

in need. A few years ago, the Alliance also added an email address, freehelp@888betsoff.org, for those who would rather "talk" through email than in person. Either way, help is available 24/7 by highly trained crisis counselors.

During the coming year, the Alliance will continue to distribute the new campaign materials, along with playing a large part in the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Midwest Conference on Problem Gambling and Substance Abuse, June 20-22, in Kansas City. The theme of this year's conference is "Inspiring Recovery Focused Outcomes." It's a three-day five-state training event offered by the Midwest Consortium on Problem Gambling and Substance Abuse (MCPGSA). If you are a counselor, the

conference offers more than 14 continuing education units provided by problem gambling, substance abuse and co-occurring disorder experts. It's a great chance to catch up on the newest research and interesting techniques while earning needed education units. I hope you can come!

On behalf of the Alliance, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your continued support during the past 20 years. May we gain an even greater awareness of problem gambling as a serious, addictive disorder during the next 20 years, along with finding new solutions to help those affected.

## An Overview of the Alliance

Created in 1997, the Missouri Alliance to Curb Problem Gambling is a partnership between the Missouri Department of Mental Health's Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse, the Missouri Gaming



Association, the Missouri Gaming Commission, the Missouri Lottery, the Port Authority of Kansas City and a recovery community representative.

The purpose of the Alliance is to educate Missourians on the potential characteristics and dangers of problem and compulsive gambling, to refer compulsive gamblers and their families and friends to free treatment through a toll-free helpline, to prevent underage play and to promote responsible gaming.

## 2016 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS) Results

The Alliance once again submitted three gambling-related questions for the Department of Health and Senior Services' Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS), and the results were made available by Health and Senior Services in late 2017. The goal of the Alliance's participation in the survey is to measure how common problem gambling is in the state. The 2016 BRFSS was the fifth time the Alliance participated in the phone survey. Results show that prevalence of problem gambling in Missouri remains at approximately 1 percent of the state's gambling population. By contrast, national results through the National Council on Problem Gambling show that roughly 3-5 percent of the nation's gambling population exhibits some sign of having a gambling problem.

## **Alliance Member-Funded Service Highlights**

## Problem Gambling Helpline: 1-888-BETSOFF (1-888-238-7633) – 1,493 Calls in 2017

Life Crisis Services (LCS) operates a 24-hour helpline service for callers seeking help for a gambling problem. The Missouri Gaming Association provides the funding for the helpline.

### Free Compulsive Gambling Treatment Services – 305 Referrals in 2017

The Missouri Department of Mental Health's Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse contracts with certified compulsive gambling counselors to provide free treatment services to compulsive gamblers and their family members. The treatment services are made possible through funding provided by the Missouri Gaming Commission. Family members can access services regardless of whether the problem gambler enters treatment. Individuals seeking referral to a counselor in a specific area can call the helpline at 1-888-BETSOFF (1-888-238-7633).

#### Bets Off Website: 888betsoff.org

The Bets Off website features a list of Missouri certified compulsive gambling counselors, information about problem gambling, the exclusion lists, the Missouri Alliance to Curb Problem Gambling, the Midwest Conference on Problem Gambling and Substance Abuse and more.

#### Voluntary Exclusion List – 758 Referrals in 2017

The Missouri Gaming Commission administers a statewide self-exclusion option for casino patrons who identify as problem and pathological gamblers. The voluntary exclusion list is also known as the List of Disassociated Persons (DAP). Individuals have the option of choosing to be placed on DAP for a lifetime or temporary exclusion. ## Missouri Lottery Self-Exclusion Program – 27 Referrals in 2017

The Missouri Lottery's voluntary Self-Exclusion Program (SEP) is a responsible gaming resource for players who classify themselves as problem or pathological gamblers to reduce the incentive to play Lottery games through voluntary lifetime self-ban agreements. SEP agreements can be downloaded at <u>MOLottery.com</u>, obtained at any Lottery office or sent through the mail. Forms must be completed entirely and notarized.
