

Powerball – Saturday, April 6 Drawing

Estimated Jackpot: \$1.3 billion; \$608.9 million cash value

- On Friday, game leaders raised the Powerball jackpot from an estimated \$1.23 billion to **\$1.3** billion. The increase is the result of strong ticket sales and an uptick in the interest rates used to fund the annuitized prize.
- This remains the 4th largest Powerball jackpot and the 8th largest U.S. lottery jackpot (PB/MM)
- This Powerball jackpot run has tied the game record for most consecutive drawings without a grand prize winner. Saturday's drawing will be the 41st drawing in the jackpot run. If the jackpot rolls again Saturday night, it will become the game's longest streak without a jackpot winner. Only two other jackpot runs have reached 41 drawings:
 - Nov. 7, 2022 \$2.04 billion PB jackpot
 - Oct. 4, 2021 \$699.8 million PB jackpot
- Nine winning Match 5 tickets in last Wednesday's Powerball drawing!
 - CA (2), GA, MA (2), MD, NJ, SC, WA
 - Since the start of the jackpot run, 66 tickets have won *Match 5* prizes (\$1 million) and six tickets have won *Match 5 + Power Play* prizes (\$2 million).
- \$500,000 Double Play[®] winner in Florida! This was the fifth Double Play ticket to win the *Match* 5 prize of \$500,000 since the start of the jackpot run.

Record U.S. Lottery Jackpots

• Four national jackpots climbed above a billion dollars last year:

- o Jan. 13, 2023 \$1.348 billion jackpot Mega Millions ME
- July 19, 2023 \$1.08 billion jackpot Powerball CA
- Aug. 8, 2023 \$1.602 billion jackpot Mega Millions FL
- Oct. 11, 2023 \$1.765 billion jackpot Powerball CA

And twice, so far, in 2024:

- o March 26, 2024 \$1.128 billion Mega Millions NJ
- April 6, 2024 \$1.3 billion est. Powerball
- The Powerball jackpot was hit five times in 2023:
 - Feb. 6, 2023 \$754.6 million WA
 - March 4, 2023 \$162.6 million VA
 - April 19, 2023 \$252.6 million OH
 - July 19, 2023 \$1.08 billion CA
 - Oct. 11, 2023 \$1.765 billion CA

And one time, so far, in 2024:

o Jan. 1, 2024 - \$842.4 million – MI

Jackpot Estimates and Game Odds

• Powerball jackpot winners may choose to receive their prize as an annuity or a lump sum payment (cash option). Both advertised prize options are prior to federal and jurisdictional taxes.



- Both advertised prize options are *estimates* based on projected ticket sales and interest rates. Differences between the estimates and final amounts may occur based on final tickets sales.
- A jackpot winner who selects the annuity will receive one immediate payment followed by 29 annual payments that increase by 5% each year.
- How is the Grand Prize estimate determined? The two main factors that determine the advertised estimate (annuity option) are ticket sales and the annuity factor. The annuity factor, or cost to fund an annuity prize, is made up of interest rates for securities purchased to fund prize payments. Higher interest rates allow us to purchase a larger annuitized prize.
- The advertised cash value is based on projected ticket sales, not the current balance of funds in the jackpot prize pool. A final cash value is calculated once ticket sales close.
- How much of a Powerball ticket goes to the jackpot? 50% of a \$2 Powerball ticket goes to fund prizes. From that dollar, 68 cents go to the jackpot prize pool, the remaining 32 cents go to the lower-tier prize pool. Powerball has set cash prizes for lower-tier prize categories, because the number of lower-tier prizes awarded increases as sales increase.
- Players have the <u>same odds in every Powerball drawing</u> regardless of the jackpot amount or how many tickets are sold for a particular drawing.
 - The overall odds of winning a prize are 1 in 24.9.
 - The odds of winning the jackpot are 1 in 292.2 million.
 - The current Powerball game matrix and odds have not changed since 2015.
- Why are jackpots won in big states and cities? Powerball was designed to be a random game every ticket has the same probability of matching the winning numbers drawn, regardless of where a ticket was sold. Typically, there are more winning tickets in densely populated areas because more tickets are sold in urban areas compared to rural areas, and therefore, more winners based upon sales volume.

About Powerball®

Powerball holds the current world record for largest national lottery jackpot at \$2.04 billion. Since its first drawing in 1992, the game has helped generate more than \$31 billion for good causes supported by U.S. lotteries. More than half of all proceeds from the sale of a Powerball ticket remain in the jurisdiction where the ticket was sold. Powerball tickets are \$2 per play. Tickets are sold in 45 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Powerball drawings are broadcast live every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday at 10:59 p.m. ET from the Florida Lottery draw studio in Tallahassee. Powerball drawings are also live streamed on Powerball.com.



About Power Play®

For an additional \$1 per play, the Power Play[®] feature can multiply non-jackpot prizes by 2, 3, 4, 5 or 10 times! The multiplier number is randomly selected before each drawing. The 10X multiplier is only in play when the advertised jackpot annuity is \$150 million or less. The *Match 5 + Power Play* prize is always \$2 million.

About Double Play®

Players can play their Powerball numbers again in a separate Double Play[®] drawing for an additional \$1 per play. Instead of a rolling jackpot, Double Play offers a \$10 million top cash prize. The Double Play drawing is held after every Powerball drawing on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. Tickets that include the Double Play feature are eligible to win prizes in both the Powerball drawing and the Double Play drawing. Double Play is available for purchase in 22 jurisdictions: Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Indiana (Hoosier), Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, U.S. Virgin Islands and Washington.
