



Powerball Fact Sheet – Wednesday, Sept. 3 Drawing

Current Estimated Jackpot: \$1.30 Billion
\$589.0 million cash value

- National ticket sales continue to rise, with a 175.4% increase in ticket sales for Monday night's Powerball drawing compared to the previous Monday drawing.
- Wednesday's jackpot ranks as the fifth largest in the Powerball game and ninth largest among U.S. lottery jackpot games.

- Wednesday's drawing will be the 41st drawing, since the Powerball jackpot was last won in California on May 31, 2025. The game's longest jackpot streak stands at 42 consecutive drawings, which was set on April 6, 2024, with a \$1.326 billion jackpot winner in Oregon.
- Big winners in Monday night's Powerball drawing, include:
 - 10 – Match 5 winning tickets (\$1 million) – CA, FL, KY, MA, MI, NJ (2), NY, PA, VA
 - 2 – Match 5+PP winning tickets (\$2 million) – MT, NC
 - 127 – Match 4+PB winning tickets (\$50,000)
 - 25 – Match 4+PB+PP winning tickets (\$150,000)
- Four Powerball jackpots have been won, so far, this year:
 - Jan 18, 2025 - \$328.5 million – Oregon
 - Mar 29, 2025 - \$526.5 million – California
 - Apr 26, 2025 - \$167.3 million – Kentucky
 - May 31, 2025 - \$204.5 million – California



- **How is the Powerball jackpot estimate determined?** The two main factors that determine the advertised jackpot annuity are projected ticket sales and the annuity factor. The annuity factor, or cost to fund an annuity prize, is made up of interest rates for securities purchased to fund prize payments. Higher interest rates allow for the purchase of a larger annuitized prize.
- **What's the difference between the annuity and cash option?** Powerball jackpot winners may choose to receive their prize as an annuity or a lump sum payment (cash option). Both advertised prize options are prior to federal and jurisdictional taxes. A jackpot winner who selects the annuity will receive one immediate payment followed by 29 annual payments that increase by 5% each year.
- **How much of a Powerball ticket goes to the jackpot?** 50% of a \$2 Powerball ticket goes to fund prizes. From that dollar, 68 cents go to the jackpot prize pool, the remaining 32 cents go to the lower-tier prize pool. Powerball has set cash prizes for lower-tier prize categories, because the number of lower-tier prizes awarded increases as ticket sales increase.
- **How much of a \$2 Powerball ticket goes to good causes?** On average, 35% of a \$2 Powerball ticket goes to fund good causes. Transfer percentages vary by lottery jurisdiction.
- **Do I have less of a chance to win, if more people are playing?** No, Powerball players have the same chance to win in every Powerball drawing, regardless of how many tickets are sold or how big the jackpot grows.
 - The overall odds of winning a prize are 1 in 24.9.
 - The odds of winning the jackpot are 1 in 292.2 million.
 - The current Powerball game matrix and odds have not changed since 2015.

About Powerball®

Powerball® holds the current world record for largest national lottery jackpot at \$2.04 billion. Since its first drawing in 1992, the game has helped generate more than \$36 billion for good causes supported by U.S. lotteries. More than half of all proceeds from the sale of a Powerball ticket remain in the jurisdiction where the ticket was sold. Powerball tickets are \$2 per play. Tickets are sold in 45 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Powerball drawings are broadcast live every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday at 10:59 p.m. ET from the Florida Lottery draw studio in Tallahassee.
