



### National Mega Millions Fast Facts for the Friday, Oct. 14, 2022 Drawing

- The estimated annuity jackpot for the Friday, Oct. 14 drawing is **\$494 million**, with an estimated cash value of **\$248.7 million**. It's the 11<sup>th</sup> highest Mega Millions jackpot to date.
- Last Mega Millions jackpot hit: \$1.337 billion (\$780.5 million cash) July 29 in Illinois.
- The last Mega Millions drawing on Oct. 11 produced 906,150 winning tickets, including:
  - **53** third-tier winners of at least \$10,000
    - (5 of the 53 winners won with the 3x Megaplier for \$30,000)
- In the 21 drawings since the last jackpot hit (*August 2 draw through Oct. 11*), there have been:
  - **22** second-tier winning tickets of at least \$1 million\* (5 of the 22 with the Megaplier)
  - **330** third-tier winning tickets of at least \$10,000\* (58 of the 330 with the Megaplier)

**With a total of 12,788,335 winning tickets** across all nine prize tiers

*\* Prizes in California paid on a pari-mutuel basis and differ from fixed prize amounts*

- Estimated annuity and cash values are announced prior to drawing dates and are based on projected sales. Differences between the estimates and final amounts may occur because a substantial percentage of sales happen on the drawing dates. The cash value is the amount of cash in the jackpot pool. If a winner chooses the annuity, the cash value is used to buy bonds that fund the annual payments.

## **National Mega Millions Fast Facts for the Friday, Oct. 14, 2022 Drawing**

- The largest Mega Millions jackpot was \$1.537 billion on October 23, 2018, with one winning ticket sold in South Carolina. The winner claimed anonymously. It was the second-largest jackpot in U.S. lottery history, trailing only the \$1.586 billion Powerball jackpot in January of 2016.

- Mega Millions tickets are sold in 47 jurisdictions: 45 states; Washington, D.C., and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
- Tickets are \$2; The Megaplier option is an additional \$1. Prizes on all Megaplier tickets are multiplied, except for the jackpot.
- Drawings are conducted at 11 p.m. Eastern Time on Tuesdays and Fridays in Atlanta, Georgia.
- The starting jackpot for the next drawing after a jackpot-winning Mega Millions ticket is sold is currently \$20 million but can vary depending on game sales and interest rates. There is no fixed minimum jackpot roll increase, which also is dependent on game sales and interest rates.
- A jackpot winner who opts for the annuity receives one immediate payment and annual payments that increase by 5% per year for 29 years.
- The “Just the Jackpot” wager type costs \$3 and gives players two Quick Pick entries for a chance to win the jackpot only. Just the Jackpot is not available in all jurisdictions.
- Overall chances of winning any prize: 1 in 24. Odds of winning the jackpot: 1 in 303 million.
- How to Play: Players select five numbers from 1 to 70 and one Mega Ball number from 1 to 25. There are [nine prize tiers](#), ranging from \$2 to the jackpot.
- Mega Millions originally launched as “The Big Game,” with its first drawing on September 6, 1996. Its name was changed to Mega Millions in 2002.
- The first Mega Millions drawing was held on May 17, 2002 and produced a \$28 million jackpot winner from Illinois.
- Beneficiaries: Lottery profits support a wide variety of good causes and are allocated differently in each jurisdiction.
