

Powerball - Monday, March 18 Drawing

Estimated Jackpot: \$645 million; \$307.3 million cash value

- This is the second Powerball® jackpot to top \$600 million this calendar year.
- The Powerball jackpot has been climbing since the beginning of the year. The jackpot was last hit on New Year's Day in Michigan by a ticket that won an \$842.4 million jackpot.
- Monday's drawing will be the 33rd drawing in the jackpot run.
- Since the start of the current jackpot run, 32 tickets have won *Match 5* prizes (\$1 million) and five tickets have won *Match 5+Power Play* prizes (\$2 million). Last Saturday's drawing produced three \$1 million-winning tickets in Michigan, New Jersey and South Carolina.
- \$500,000 Double Play winner in Iowa For the second time this year, a player has won Double Play's *Match 5* prize worth \$500,000. Double Play is an add-on feature that gives players in participating jurisdictions another chance to match their Powerball numbers in a separate drawing with a top cash prize of \$10 million. Players can add the Double Play feature to their Powerball ticket for an additional \$1 per play. There was a \$500,000 Double Play winner in Florida in the March 9 drawing.
- Lower-tier cash prizes adding up! There were more than 1.3 million winning tickets in last Saturday's drawing that won a combined \$12 million in lower-tier prizes, including 35 tickets that won \$50,000 prizes and 6 tickets won \$100,000 prizes.
- Coverage of all possible number combinations was estimated at 10.3% in last Saturday's drawing.
- The last time Powerball and Mega Millions concurrently had advertised jackpots above half a billion dollars was in July 2023, which resulted in back-to-back billion dollar jackpots being won among the two games:
 - O July 19, 2023 \$1.08 billion jackpot Powerball CA
 - o Aug. 8, 2023 \$1.602 billion jackpot Mega Millions FL
- Four national jackpots climbed above a billion dollars last year:
 - o Jan. 13, 2023 \$1.348 billion Mega Millions ME
 - July 19, 2023 \$1.08 billion jackpot Powerball CA
 - o Aug. 8, 2023 \$1.602 billion jackpot Mega Millions FL
 - Oct. 11, 2023 \$1.765 billion jackpot Powerball CA
- The Powerball jackpot was hit five times in 2023:
 - o Feb. 6, 2023 \$754.6 million WA



- o March 4, 2023 \$162.6 million VA
- o April 19, 2023 \$252.6 million OH
- July 19, 2023 \$1.08 billion CA
- o Oct. 11, 2023 \$1.765 billion CA

And one time, so far, in 2024:

o Jan. 1, 2024 - \$842.4 million – MI

Jackpot Estimates and Game Odds

- Powerball jackpot winners may choose to receive their prize as an annuity or a lump sum payment (cash option). Both advertised prize options are prior to federal and jurisdictional taxes.
- Both advertised prize options are estimates based on projected ticket sales and interest rates.
 Differences between the estimates and final amounts may occur based on final tickets sales.
- A jackpot winner who selects the annuity will receive one immediate payment followed by 29 annual payments that increase by 5% each year.
- How is the Grand Prize estimate determined? The two main factors that determine the advertised
 estimate (annuity option) are ticket sales and the annuity factor. The annuity factor, or cost to fund
 an annuity prize, is made up of interest rates for securities purchased to fund prize payments.
 Higher interest rates allow us to purchase a larger annuitized prize.
- The advertised cash value is based on projected ticket sales, not the current balance of funds in the jackpot prize pool. A final cash value is calculated once ticket sales close.
- How much of a Powerball ticket goes to the jackpot? 50% of a \$2 Powerball ticket goes to fund prizes. From that dollar, 68 cents go to the jackpot prize pool, the remaining 32 cents go to the lower-tier prize pool. Powerball has set cash prizes for lower-tier prize categories, because the number of lower-tier prizes awarded increases as sales increase.
- Players have the <u>same odds in every Powerball drawing</u> regardless of the jackpot amount or how many tickets are sold for a particular drawing.
 - o The overall odds of winning a prize are 1 in 24.9.
 - The odds of winning the jackpot are 1 in 292.2 million.
 - The current Powerball game matrix and odds have not changed since 2015.

About Powerball®

Powerball holds the current world record for largest national lottery jackpot at \$2.04 billion. Since its first drawing in 1992, the game has helped generate more than \$31 billion for good causes supported by U.S. lotteries. More than half of all proceeds from the sale of a Powerball ticket remain in the jurisdiction where the ticket was sold. Powerball tickets are \$2 per play. Tickets are sold in 45 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Powerball drawings are broadcast live every



Monday, Wednesday and Saturday at 10:59 p.m. ET from the Florida Lottery draw studio in Tallahassee. Powerball drawings are also live streamed on Powerball.com.

About Power Play®

For an additional \$1 per play, the Power Play® feature can multiply non-jackpot prizes by 2, 3, 4, 5 or 10 times! The multiplier number is randomly selected before each drawing. The 10X multiplier is only in play when the advertised jackpot annuity is \$150 million or less. The *Match 5 + Power Play* prize is always \$2 million.

About Double Play®

Players can play their Powerball numbers again in a separate Double Play® drawing for an additional \$1 per play. Instead of a rolling jackpot, Double Play offers a \$10 million top cash prize. The Double Play drawing is held after every Powerball drawing on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. Tickets that include the Double Play feature are eligible to win prizes in both the Powerball drawing and the Double Play drawing. Double Play is available for purchase in 22 jurisdictions: Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Indiana (Hoosier), Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, U.S. Virgin Islands and Washington.
