

## **FY24 Missouri Lottery Proceeds Appropriations**

Since 1986, the Missouri Lottery has contributed more than \$7.5 billion to the state of Missouri and public education. Annual Lottery contributions comprise 3-4% of the state's funding for public education – an effort shared by local, state and federal governments.

For fiscal year 2024, more than \$528 million from Lottery proceeds have been appropriated to Missouri's public education programs by the Missouri Legislature through House Bills 2, 3 and 6 from the First Regular Session of the 102<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly.
